Walk the Kindness Way

Walk the Kindness Way started as an initiative to bring Fairview and Parkwood together by trekking from one community to the other along the Walter Bean – Grand River Trail.

However, over the years, *Walk the Kindness Way* has become so much more then a weekend trek, it has grown to become a summer long resident program, a stronger connection to our partners and a major fundraising initiative with the goal of supporting the future residents, families and team members.

Residents

Starting in July, the residents of Fairview and Parkwood start their trek, counting all of their steps until the *Walk the Kindness Way* weekend in September, with the goal of completing the 42 km distance. This year, the residents and tenants well surpassed any expectations by walking the trail an astounding 220 times!

Connection

Walk the Kindness Way is open to all, and we are grateful for the team members, community partners, families and friends who support this initiative. For the past two years, over 100 participants have completed the walk, including Don Elliott, our tenant from the Fairview Seniors Community Apartments, who has walked the trail three consecutive years! Congratulations Don – you are truly an inspiration to us all!

Fundraising

As you may be aware, two years ago the Walk Committee made a commitment to use the funds raised to develop Healing Gardens at Fairview and Parkwood. This is a five-year commitment to raise \$250,000. Thanks to the support of our congregations, board members, residents, families, partners, sponsors and team members we are pleased to announce we are more then half way to our goal – with \$142,000 raised!

Words cannot express our heartfelt gratitude for your support. Your time, talent and financial resources are building a sanctuary for the community by providing positive escapes to reflect and disconnect from concerns and anxieties.

The Walk Committee has already started planning the 2023 *Walk the Kindness Way* trek – we hope you will join us on June 3 and 4, 2023.

In September, construction of *The Delphine and Lloyd Martin Apartments* commenced. This development supports our vision to 'Build a Community for All', as 30 percent of the one-bedroom apartments will be offered as affordable housing.

Although completion anticipated in Winter 2023/24, the excitement of *The Delphine and Lloyd Martin Apartments* is growing with inquiries into the waitlist.

We are pleased to share that a Presentation Centre is scheduled to

open in January 2023. The Centre will provide additional details such as floor plans, pricing and amenities.

Those who are on the wait list will also be provided with the opportunity to secure their unit with a deposit.
